Glad that's okay - not sure I could have made it simpler!

Declared records that are either marked for deletion by a user or are swept up at the end of the review year if nothing is done with them are removed from the BDB and placed in the ERMS Management DB.

Undeclared documents that are either marked for deletion by a user or are swept up after they reach a year old are removed from the BDB and placed in the BDB Holding DB.

In both cases, the actual documents / records and any associated responses are held in either one of our databases so that we can restore them to a BDB within a certain amount of time if the user gets in touch and, in the case of the declared records only, so that Records Management can conduct a secondary review, looking at the information to determine if there's any potential interest for The National Archives.

In both cases if Records Management delete records or documents from either the ERMS Management DB or the BDB Holding DB, a log is maintained saying which titles were deleted, when and by who.


