Our position is confusing.

In legislation sex and gender are invariably treated as one and the same. But strictly speaking they are not.

We consider sex to be a biological construct that can be objectively determined based on someone's hormone levels, chromosomes and organs. Gender we consider to be a social construct – an internal sense of identity. In the vast majority of cases this will be the same as sex as assigned at birth but sometimes it isn't.
