Thanks for your email.

Currently HALE is under a lot of pressure to cover different aspects of the COVID pandemic and publish BAU outputs (like the suicide releases out today). We are therefore having to make difficult decisions around priorities so we can deliver new work around long-covid for example, and continue to release key outputs such as weekly and monthly deaths. At present updating the COVID occupations analysis has not been prioritised over other work.

We are looking at getting funding for additional staff, but this is not guaranteed and also would take time. So presently we do not have any firm plans to update the occupation analysis. I know that will disappointing to some users. We can update the release to that affect. Happy to discuss.

Thanks for that, extremely helpful in understanding the situation. Unfortunately, I'm not available tomorrow afternoon, so if it's ok can I share my reflections by email.

It is very understandable at this time that producer teams are having to make decisions and prioritise work, and the Code does support this – thinking particularly of V1.6. I think however the reasons for not providing further updates aren't explained to users and coupled with the fact that the <u>June output</u> has 'Next release: To be announced', a user or interested party might expect more data to be released.

No doubt there continues to be interest in breakdowns by occupation and understanding the data for specific sub-categories that may be masked by the broad occupational breakdowns. We are certainly aware of interest in data on teachers, and we have seen this come through on social media.

I did wonder if a data only refresh might give you the opportunity to explain your rationale, evidence that by releasing updated data 6 months on, and allowing you communicate your future plans for this output.

Hi Marie,

Unfortunately I'm in meetings all day until 3pm, and then need to quickly finish something off for a sage request.

I have good availability for tomorrow afternoon if that's any good?

With regards to any future updates. We are not currently planning to update the coronavirus deaths by occupation analysis.

Looking at our previous publications, there was no difference in the pattern of findings when comparing our <u>first</u> and <u>second</u> releases, despite the number of deaths being 94% higher (from 1,852 to 3,600 deaths) in the second release.

Since the second release, there has been an increase of 34% (1,209) in the number of deaths among the working age population with a recorded occupation (weekly deaths file from a week ago). Looking at the latest data, the distribution of covid19 deaths across the 9 major occupation groups by sex is almost the same when compared to the <u>previous release</u>. The higher number of deaths now is unlikely to make much difference when added to the 300+ individual occupations by sex.

As most of the covid19 deaths aren't in the working age population, the pattern by occupation will change a lot more slowly if at all.

Since the previous release, we have provided some updates for the health and social care groups on the ad hoc website. We could also consider doing this for other groups if there is a need to do so.
