Subject: FW: Proposed change to the geographical coverage of VS4 and VS4d

Dear VSOB team

Late last year, we became aware of the proposal to change the geographic basis for the local VS4 and VS4D data, and just wished to make some observations. Unfortunately, I have just realised that this is now a couple of days outside the stated deadline, but I hope you can still consider the following thoughts.

I note the reasons behind the proposed move to MSOAs as the geography for this data, but I would like to suggest that ward boundaries remain the primary geography, particularly for table VS4 – the live births and deaths data. As a local authority, most of our local area analysis is still required on the basis of wards – as our most commonly-identified communities and the main channels for local political representation and the organisation/provision of services. Birth and death rates are an important element of demographic analysis at a ward level, whether in both general / ward profiles and for specific pieces of work, e.g. birth rates for school place planning, death rates for social care issues. Having the data only on the basis of MSOAs will make this work much more difficult to undertake *and* explain/report to colleagues – most of whom are happy thinking in terms of wards but not MSOAs.

In terms of the 'Alternative options' identified on page 2 of the paper, either Wards or the '2011 Census merged wards' may be acceptable for the VS4 table – there are advantages in both. If the merged wards were ONS' preferred option after MSOAs, we could probably work with them, as a more recognisable (but still more 'fixed') geography.

To a lesser (although increasing) extent, LSOAs are becoming more used as a local geography for both research and policy. However, at this stage, MSOAs remain very rarely used for any of our local analysis – in effect, only where there is no alternative option for a particular piece of work. In terms of the VS4D table, I have a less strong view, in as much as I use this table less often than VS4. To my knowledge, this table is used more by analyst colleagues in our Public Health team and local Health Board (not surprising, as it revolves around cause of death), who have already moved further down

the road of MSOA use for their local analytical work – often out of necessity due to the low numbers involved for certain episodes/causes.

I hope you find these comments useful, and apologies once again for being a little late submitting a response. I would be very grateful if you could keep me informed of the outcome or future developments on this issue.
