

# **SUMMARY**

#### **CPIH**

The Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) is the most comprehensive measure of inflation. It extends the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) to include a measure of the costs associated with owning, maintaining and living in one's own home, known as owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH), along with council tax. Both of these are significant expenses for many households and are not included in the CPI.

Aside from including owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH) and council tax, CPIH is otherwise identical to CPI. This means that, aside from these two components, the factors contributing to the CPI rate are the same as those contributing to the CPIH. For example, if food is reported as increasing the CPIH rate, it is also acting to increase the CPI rate. The size of the contributions for components other than OOH and council tax are exaggerated in the CPI compared with the CPIH because they account for a larger proportion of the overall index.

The <u>National Statistics</u> status of the Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) was reinstated on 31 July 2017. <u>A letter</u> from the Director General for Regulation to the National Statistician detailed the actions that were taken to meet the requirements as set out in the <u>CPIH</u> assessment report.

The main movements for CPIH in December 2017 are:

- The all items CPIH is 105.0, up from 104.7 in November.
- The all items CPIH annual rate is 2.7%, down from 2.8% in November.
- The annual rate for CPIH excluding indirect taxes, CPIHY, is 2.5%, down from 2.6% last month.
- The OOH component of CPIH is 104.9, unchanged from last month.
- The OOH component annual rate is 1.3%, down from 1.5% last month.
- The CPIH all goods index is 103.4, unchanged from last month.
- The CPIH all goods index annual rate is 3.4%, up from 3.3% last month.
- The CPIH all services index is 106.1, up from 105.6 in November.
- The CPIH all services index annual rate is 2.2%, down from 2.4% last month.

#### **Consumer Prices Index (CPI)**

The CPI continues to be a National Statistic and is a measure of consumer price inflation produced to international standards and in line with European regulations. First published in 1997 as the



Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP), the CPI is the inflation measure used in the Government's target for inflation.

The CPI is also used for purposes such as uprating pensions, wages and benefits and can aid in the understanding of inflation on family budgets. For more information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for CPI in December 2017 are:

- The all items CPI is 104.9, up from 104.6 in November.
- The all items CPI annual rate is 3.0%, down from 3.1% in November.
- The annual rate for CPI excluding indirect taxes, CPIY, is 2.8%, down from 2.9% last month.
- The annual rate for CPI at constant tax rates, CPI-CT, is 2.7%, down from 2.9% last month.
- The CPI all goods index is 103.4, up from 103.3 in November.
- The CPI all goods index annual rate is 3.4%, up from 3.3% last month.
- The CPI all services index is 106.6, up from 105.9 in November.
- The CPI all services index annual rate is 2.5%, down from 2.8% last month.


#### **Retail Prices Index (RPI)**

In accordance with the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007, the Retail Prices Index and its derivatives have been assessed against the Code of Practice for Official Statistics and found not to meet the required standard for designation as National Statistics. The <u>full</u> <u>assessment report</u> can be found on the UK Statistics Authority website.

The RPI is a legacy measure of UK inflation that continues to be published because of its use in long-term contracts and index-linked gilts. For further information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for RPI in December 2017 are:

- The all items RPI is 278.1, up from 275.8 in November.
- The all items RPI annual rate is 4.1%, up from 3.9% last month.
- The annual rate for RPIX, the all items RPI excluding mortgage interest payments (MIPs), is 4.2%, up from 4.0% last month.
- The all goods RPI is 210.5, up from 209.7 in November.
- The all goods RPI annual rate is 4.5%, up from 4.2% last month.
- The all services RPI is 381.0, up from 376.0 in November.
- The all services RPI annual rate is 3.9%, up from 3.8% last month.

#### Large downward effects came from:

• Transport, particularly air fares and to a lesser extent coach and rail fares. As is usually the case in December, air fares rose sharply, with the increase being of a similar magnitude to the previous year. However, because air fares account for a smaller proportion of the basket of goods and services in 2017, the impact of the rise in prices on the contribution of air fares to the headline rate was smaller in 2017 than in 2016. This in turn resulted in air fares making a downward contribution to the change in the rate. These downward contributions were partially offset by prices for motor fuel, which increased between November and December 2017, having fallen a year ago;



- Recreation and culture, with prices overall falling between November and December 2017
  having been unchanged in the same period a year ago. This fall follows three successive
  months of relatively large increases in prices when compared with previous years. The
  largest effects came from prices for games and toys, which fell between November and
  December 2017 by more than they did a year ago, along with audio-visual products, for
  which prices fell between November and December 2017, having risen in the same period
  last year; and
- Housing and household services, mainly from owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH),
  with prices increasing by less between November and December 2017 than they did a year
  ago. OOH costs have changed little since September 2017, following an increasing trend
  seen since mid-2010.

#### A large upward effect came from:

Tobacco, with prices increasing by more this year than they did a year ago. This reflects
duty increases announced in the Autumn Budget.

- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago, with the main downward contribution coming from premium potato crisps, where prices overall fell this year by more than a year ago.

#### Sugar, jam, syrups, chocolate and confectionery

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago.

#### Food products not elsewhere covered

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago.





# **RECONCILIATION OF CPI AND RPI**

#### (Table 5 of the Consumer Price Inflation Dataset)

This table identifies the main factors contributing to the differences between the unrounded inflation rates for the CPI and the RPI. These differences are broken down into: mortgage interest payments, other housing components excluded from the CPI, other differences in the coverage of goods and services, and the formula effect. The final column titled 'other differences including weights' is derived as a residual.

This table currently compares CPI with RPI. In due course it will be updated to compare CPIH with RPI.

The difference between the CPI and RPI unrounded annual rates in December 2017 was -1.14 percentage points, widening from -0.79 percentage points in November 2017.

The main factors contributing to the widening were:

- Mortgage interest payments, which increased the RPI 12-month rate by 0.11 percentage points between November and December 2017 but are excluded from the CPI.
- Other differences including weights, which increased the RPI 12-month rate relative to
  the CPI 12-month rate by 0.25 percentage points between November and December 2017.
  The effect came mainly from air fares; fuels and lubricants; and games, toys and hobbies
  and equipment for sport and open-air recreation. This was partially offset by insurance and
  sea fares.



#### **TRANSPORT**

#### **Fuels and Lubricants**

- The price of oil has hit \$70 a barrel for the first time since December 2014.
   Brent crude climbed after member of Opec, the cartel of 14 oil-producing nations that accounts for 40% of the world's output, said it would continue to limit supplies. (bbc.co.uk 11 January 2018)
- When considering the price of petrol between December 2017 and January 2018, it may be
  useful to note that the average price of petrol rose by 4.0 pence per litre between December
  2016 and January 2017, standing at 118.6 pence per litre as measured in the CPIH.
- A 1 pence change on average in the cost of a litre of motor fuel contributes approximately
   0.02 percentage points to the 1-month change in the CPIH.

#### **HOUSING (RPI)**

#### Mortgage interest payments (MIPs)

- The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.5% on Thursday 14 December 2017. The next announcement and minutes from the Bank of England's Monetary Policy Committee are scheduled to be published on 8 February 2018.
- The change in average mortgage interest rates recorded in the RPI was -0.01 percentage points between December 2016 and January 2017. The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.25% in December 2016.
- A one percentage point change in the average mortgage interest rate contributes approximately 0.9 percentage points to the 1-month percentage change in the RPI.
