SUMMARY

CPIH

The Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) is the most comprehensive measure of inflation. It extends the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) to include a measure of the costs associated with owning, maintaining and living in one's own home, known as owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH), along with Council Tax. Both of these are significant expenses for many households and are not included in the CPI.

Aside from including owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH) and Council Tax, CPIH is otherwise identical to CPI. This means that, aside from these two components, the factors contributing to the CPI rate are the same as those contributing to the CPIH. For example, if food is reported as increasing the CPIH rate, it is also acting to increase the CPI rate. The size of the contributions for components other than OOH and Council Tax are exaggerated in the CPI compared with the CPIH because they account for a larger proportion of the overall index.

The <u>National Statistics</u> status of the CPIH was reinstated on 31 July 2017. <u>A letter from the Director General for Regulation to the National Statistician detailed the actions that were taken to meet the requirements as set out in the CPIH assessment report.</u>

The main movements for CPIH in December 2019 are:

- The all items CPIH is 108.5, unchanged from last month.
- The all items CPIH annual rate is 1.4%, down from 1.5% in November.
- The annual rate for CPIH excluding indirect taxes, CPIHY, is 1.3%, down from 1.4% last month.
- The OOH component of CPIH is 107.5, up from 107.3 in November.
- The OOH component annual rate is 1.2%, unchanged from last month.
- The CPIH all goods index is 105.8, down from 106.1 in November.
- The CPIH all goods index annual rate is 0.6%, up from 0.5% last month.
- The CPIH all services index is 110.5, up from 110.3 in November.
- The CPIH all services index annual rate is 1.9%, down from 2.2% last month.

Consumer Prices Index (CPI)

The CPI continues to be a National Statistic and is a measure of consumer price inflation produced to international standards and in line with European regulations. First published in 1997 as the Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP), the CPI is the inflation measure used in the Government's target for inflation.



The CPI is also used for purposes such as uprating pensions, wages and benefits and can aid in the understanding of inflation on family budgets. For more information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for CPI in December 2019 are:

- The all items CPI is 108.5, unchanged from last month.
- The all items CPI annual rate is 1.3%, down from 1.5% in November.
- The annual rate for CPI excluding indirect taxes, CPIY, is 1.3%, down from 1.5% last month.
- The annual rate for CPI at constant tax rates, CPI-CT, is 1.3%, down from 1.4% last month.
- The CPI all goods index is 105.9, down from 106.2 in November.
- The CPI all goods index annual rate is 0.6%, unchanged from last month.
- The CPI all services index is 111.5, up from 111.2 in November.
- The CPI all services index annual rate is 2.1%, down from 2.5% last month.

Retail Prices Index (RPI)

In accordance with the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007, the Retail Prices Index and its derivatives have been assessed against the Code of Practice for Official Statistics and found not to meet the required standard for designation as National Statistics. The <u>full</u> <u>assessment report</u> can be found on the UK Statistics Authority website.

The RPI is a legacy measure of UK inflation that continues to be published because of its use in long-term contracts and index-linked gilts. For further information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for RPI in December 2019 are:

- The all items RPI is 291.9, up from 291.0 in November.
- The all items RPI annual rate is 2.2%, unchanged from last month.
- The annual rate for RPIX, the all items RPI excluding mortgage interest payments (MIPs), is 2.2%, down from 2.3% last month.
- The all goods RPI is 219.4, down from 219.6 in November.
- The all goods RPI annual rate is 1.7%, up from 1.6% last month.
- The all services RPI is 402.5, up from 399.4 in November.
- The all services RPI annual rate is 2.7%, down from 3.1% last month.

Large downward effects came from:

- Restaurants and hotels, where prices for overnight hotel accommodation fell by 7.5% between November and December 2019, compared with a rise of 0.9% between November and December 2018; and
- Clothing and footwear, where the largest individual downward contributions came from
 women's casual jackets and cardigans, where prices fell between November and
 December 2019 but rose between the same two months in 2018. There were also small
 individual downward contributions from formal trousers and formal skirts. There is evidence
 of increased discounting, with the proportion of women's clothing items recorded on sale
 being higher in December 2019 than in December 2018.



Small downward effects came from:

- Food and non-alcoholic beverages, where prices overall rose between November and December 2019 but by less than a year ago. There were downward contributions from bread and cereals, and margarine or low-fat spread, where prices rose between November and December 2019 but by less than between the same two months in 2018. Sugar, jam, syrups, chocolate and confectionery (where prices fell by 2.1% in 2019, compared with a fall of 0.1% in 2018) also had a small downward contribution. These were partially offset by upward contributions from vegetables (including potatoes and tubers) and fruit; and
- Transport, which overall had a small downward contribution (of 0.02 percentage points) to change in the 12-month CPIH inflation rate. A large downward contribution (of 0.10 percentage points) from transport services came predominantly from airfares, where prices rose between November and December 2019 but by less than between the same two months in 2018. The timing of the price collection days in relation to Christmas may have been a factor. There was also a smaller downward contribution from the purchase of vehicles where prices overall were little changed in 2019 but increased by 0.7% in 2018. These were partially offset by a large upward movement (of 0.10 percentage points) from fuels and lubricants, where prices fell between November and December 2019 but by less than between the same two months of 2018.

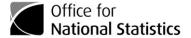
Small upward effects came from:

- Furniture, household equipment and maintenance, with prices rising by 1.4% between November and December 2019 compared with a smaller rise of 1.0% between the same two months in 2018. There were small upward contributions from furniture and furnishings, and major appliances and small electrical goods; and
- Communication, where mobile phone charges increased between November and December 2019 by more than between the same two months in 2018.

Bread and cereals

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year by less than a year ago, with the main downward contribution coming from chocolate biscuits, dried potted snacks and breakfast cereal.
- Partially offset by a small upward contribution coming from packs of individual cakes, where
 prices overall rose this year but fell a year ago.

Oils and fats

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year by less than a year ago, particularly for margarine/low fat spread.

Fruit

- Small upward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year but fell a year ago, with the main upward contribution coming from packets of peanuts.

Vegetables including potatoes

- Small upward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year by more than a year ago, with the main upward contribution coming from premium potato crisps.

Sugar, jam, syrups, chocolate and confectionery

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year by more than a year ago, with the main downward contributions coming from cartons/boxes of chocolates and chocolate covered ice-cream bars.



- The average price of petrol across the month, as recorded for the CPIH, fell by 0.9 pence per litre between November and December 2019, to stand at 124.6 pence per litre.
- Last year, the average price of petrol fell by 6.4 pence per litre between November and



December 2018, to stand at 121.7 pence per litre.

 The average price of diesel fell by 0.4 pence per litre between November and December 2019 to stand at 129.9 pence per litre, compared with a fall of 4.6 pence per litre a year earlier, to stand at 131.9 pence per litre.

RECONCILIATION OF CPIH AND RPI

(Table 5a of the Consumer Price Inflation Dataset)

This table identifies the main factors contributing to the differences between the unrounded inflation rates for the CPIH and the RPI. These differences are broken down into: mortgage interest payments, other housing components excluded from the CPIH, imputed rents (included in CPIH as a measure of owner occupiers' housing costs and excluded from RPI), other differences in the coverage of goods and services, and the formula effect. The final component titled 'other differences including weights' is derived as a residual.

The corresponding figures for the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) can be found in Table 5b of the Consumer price inflation dataset.

The difference between the CPIH and RPI unrounded annual rates in December 2019 was -0.85 percentage points, widening from -0.75 percentage points in November 2019.

The main factors contributing to the widening were:

- Other housing components, which increased the RPI 12-month rate relative to the CPIH 12-month rate by 0.06 percentage points between November and December 2019. The effect came mainly from house depreciation.
- Other differences including weights, which increased the RPI 12-month rate relative to
 the CPIH 12-month rate by 0.02 percentage points between November and December
 2019. The effect came mainly from insurance, and fuels and lubricants. This was partially
 offset by a narrowing effect from air fares.

There were no significant offsetting factors.



TRANSPORT

Fuels and Lubricants

- Oil prices have dropped slightly due to extending days of losses as the threat of war in the
 Middle East receded and investors switched attention to economic growth prospects and the
 rise in U.S. crude oil and product inventories. Brent crude oil fell 20 cents, or 0.3%, at \$65.17
 a barrel, and is heading for its first decline in six weeks, down 5%. West Texas Intermediate
 crude was down 20 cents, or 0.3%, at \$59.36 a barrel. (uk.reuters.com 10 January 2020)
- When considering the price of petrol between December 2019 and January 2020, it may be
 useful to note that the average price of petrol fell by 2.1 pence per litre between December
 2018 January 2019, to stand at 119.6 pence per litre as measured in the CPIH.
- A 1 pence change on average in the cost of a litre of motor fuel contributes approximately
 0.02 percentage points to the 1-month change in the CPIH.



HOUSING (RPI)

Mortgage interest payments (MIPs)

- The Bank of England Bank Rate was unchanged at 0.75% on Thursday 19 December 2019.
 The next announcement and minutes from the Bank of England's Monetary Policy
 Committee are scheduled to be published on 30 January 2020.
- The change in average mortgage interest rates recorded in the RPI was -0.01 percentage points between December 2018 and January 2019. The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.75% in December 2018.
- A one percentage point change in the average mortgage interest rate contributes approximately 1.0 percentage points to the 1-month percentage change in the RPI.



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
