Consumer Price Inflation July 2018

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This note is produced as background briefing for the Consumer Price Inflation Statistical Bulletin. Users who require authoritative figures should use the Consumer Price Inflation Statistical Bulletin or Consumer Price Inflation Dataset.



SUMMARY

CPIH

The Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) is the most comprehensive measure of inflation. It extends the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) to include a measure of the costs associated with owning, maintaining and living in one's own home, known as owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH), along with council tax. Both of these are significant expenses for many households and are not included in the CPI.

Aside from including owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH) and council tax, CPIH is otherwise identical to CPI. This means that, aside from these two components, the factors contributing to the CPI rate are the same as those contributing to the CPIH. For example, if food is reported as increasing the CPIH rate, it is also acting to increase the CPI rate. The size of the contributions for components other than OOH and council tax are exaggerated in the CPI compared with the CPIH because they account for a larger proportion of the overall index.

The <u>National Statistics</u> status of the Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) was reinstated on 31 July 2017. <u>A letter</u> from the Director General for Regulation to the National Statistician detailed the actions that were taken to meet the requirements as set out in the CPIH assessment report.

The main movements for CPIH in July 2018 are:

- The all items CPIH is 105.9, unchanged from last month.
- The all items CPIH annual rate is 2.3%, unchanged from last month.
- The annual rate for CPIH excluding indirect taxes, CPIHY, is 2.2%, unchanged from last month.
- The OOH component of CPIH is 105.6, up from 105.4 in June.
- The OOH component annual rate is 1.1%, unchanged from last month.
- The CPIH all goods index is 103.3, down from 103.9 in June.
- The CPIH all goods index annual rate is 2.6%, up from 2.5% last month.
- The CPIH all services index is 107.7, up from 107.3 in June.
- The CPIH all services index annual rate is 2.0%, unchanged from last month.

Consumer Prices Index (CPI)

The CPI continues to be a National Statistic and is a measure of consumer price inflation produced to international standards and in line with European regulations. First published in 1997 as the



Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP), the CPI is the inflation measure used in the Government's target for inflation.

The CPI is also used for purposes such as uprating pensions, wages and benefits and can aid in the understanding of inflation on family budgets. For more information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for CPI in July 2018 are:

- The all items CPI is 105.8, unchanged from last month.
- The all items CPI annual rate is 2.5%, up from 2.4% in June.
- The annual rate for CPI excluding indirect taxes, CPIY, is 2.5%, up from 2.4% last month.
- The annual rate for CPI at constant tax rates, CPI-CT, is 2.4%, up from 2.3% last month.
- The CPI all goods index is 103.3, down from 103.9 in June.
- The CPI all goods index annual rate is 2.6%, unchanged from last month.
- The CPI all services index is 108.5, up from 107.9 in June.
- The CPI all services index annual rate is 2.3%, unchanged from last month.

Retail Prices Index (RPI)

In accordance with the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007, the Retail Prices Index and its derivatives have been assessed against the Code of Practice for Official Statistics and found not to meet the required standard for designation as National Statistics. The <u>full</u> <u>assessment report</u> can be found on the UK Statistics Authority website.

The RPI is a legacy measure of UK inflation that continues to be published because of its use in long-term contracts and index-linked gilts. For further information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for RPI in July 2018 are:

- The all items RPI is 281.7, up from 281.5 in June.
- The all items RPI annual rate is 3.2%, down from 3.4% last month.
- The annual rate for RPIX, the all items RPI excluding mortgage interest payments (MIPs), is 3.3%, down from 3.4% last month.
- The all goods RPI is 212.2, down from 214.0 in June.
- The all goods RPI annual rate is 3.6%, down from 3.8% last month.
- The all services RPI is 387.7, up from 383.8 in June.
- The all services RPI annual rate is 2.9%, unchanged from last month.

Large upward effects came from:

- Recreation and culture, with the main effect coming from an increase in prices for computer
 games, although these are heavily dependent on the composition of bestseller charts, often resulting
 in large overall price changes from month to month; and
- Transport, with passenger transport fares seeing larger price rises between June and July 2018 compared with the same period a year ago. Motor fuels also made an upward contribution, with prices falling by less between June and July 2018 than they did a year ago. These upward effects were partially offset by a downward contribution from the sale of new cars, where prices were little changed between June and July this year but rose between the same two months a year ago.



Large downward effects came from:

- **Miscellaneous goods and services**, in particular insurance and the initial charges for unit trust investments. Some companies have recently removed their initial fees for these investments; and
- Clothing and footwear, with prices falling by 3.7% between June and July 2018, compared with a smaller fall of 2.9% between the same two months a year ago. The effect came mainly from women's clothing and footwear.

Bread and cereals

- Partially offset by a small downward contribution from chocolate biscuits, where prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago.

Meat

- Small upward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year but fell a year ago, particularly for deli type meats and cooked ham.

Milk, cheese and eggs

- Small upward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year by more than a year ago, with the main upward contribution coming from yoghurt/fromage frais.
- Partially offset by a small downward contribution coming from cheese spread, where prices overall rose this year by less than a year ago.

Oils and fats

- Small upward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year but fell a year ago, particularly for margarine/low fat spread.

Vegetables including potatoes

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago.

Sugar, jam, syrups, chocolate and confectionery

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year by less than a year ago, with the main downward contributions coming from ice cream.
- Partially offset by a small upward contribution coming from large bars of chocolate.

Food products not elsewhere covered

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year by less than a year ago.

Fuels and lubricants

- The average price of petrol across the month, as recorded for the CPIH, fell by 0.8 pence per litre between June and July 2018, to stand at 127.2 pence per litre.
- Last year, the average price of petrol fell by 1.4 pence per litre between June and July 2017, to stand at 113.9 pence per litre.

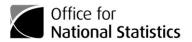

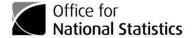

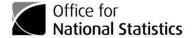

Diesel prices fell by 1.1 pence per litre, to stand at 131.5 pence per litre in July 2018, compared with a larger fall of 2.5 pence per litre last year, to stand at 115.3 pence per litre; and
 - **Maintenance of motor vehicles**, where prices overall rose this year by more than a year ago.

RECONCILIATION OF CPI AND RPI

(Table 5 of the Consumer Price Inflation Dataset)

This table identifies the main factors contributing to the differences between the unrounded inflation rates for the CPI and the RPI. These differences are broken down into: mortgage interest payments, other housing components excluded from the CPI, other differences in the coverage of goods and services, and the formula effect. The final column titled 'other differences including weights' is derived as a residual.

This table currently compares CPI with RPI. In due course it will be updated to compare CPIH with RPI.

The difference between the CPI and RPI unrounded annual rates in July 2018 was -0.76 percentage points, narrowing from -0.95 percentage points in June 2018.

The main factors contributing to the narrowing were:

- Other differences including weights, which decreased the RPI 12-month rate relative to
 the CPI 12-month rate by 0.2 percentage points between June and July 2018. The effect
 came mainly from games, toys and hobbies and equipment for sport and open-air
 recreation; insurance; and furniture and furnishings, carpets and household textiles.
- Other housing components, which decreased the RPI 12-month rate relative to the CPI 12-month rate by 0.05 percentage points between June and July 2018. The effect came mainly from house depreciation.

The main offsetting factor was:

Other differences in coverage of goods and services, which increased the RPI 12-month rate relative to the CPI 12-month rate by 0.05 percentage points between June and July 2018. The effect came mainly from financial services.

FOOD

Seasonal Food

 Seasonal food prices have shown a mixed pattern of rises and falls in August of previous years, but are typically dependent on weather conditions both in the UK and around the world.

HOUSING, WATER, ELECTRICITY, GAS AND OTHER FUELS

Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels

 E.ON has announced that it is increasing its standard variable electricity and gas prices. On 16 August, the unit price of E.ON's standard variable tariff will increase by an average of 4.8% or £55 for customers taking both fuels, 6.2% or £36 for electricity only customers and 3.3% or £19 for gas only customers. - EDF Energy has announced a change to its standard variable tariff prices, effective from 31
 August 2018. EDF Energy's standard variable dual fuel tariff will increase by 6% to £1,228 a
 year. The standard variable electricity and gas tariffs will be increasing by 6.1% and 6%
 respectively. (edfenergy.com 5 July 2018)
- British Gas has announced a 3.8% increase in its standard variable tariff (SVT) from 1
 October meaning the average bill will rise by £44, taking it to £1,205 a year. (bbc.co.uk 8 July 2018)

TRANSPORT

Fuels and Lubricants

- Oil prices steadied on Friday as concerns that a global trade dispute will slow economic
 growth and demand for fuel were balanced by U.S. sanctions against Iran that look set to
 tighten supply. Benchmark Brent crude oil was up 20 cents at \$72.27 a barrel by 1120 GMT
 U.S. light crude was 10 cents higher at \$66.91 a barrel. (uk.reuters.com 10 August 2018)
- When considering the price of petrol between July and August 2018, it may be useful to note that the average price of petrol rose by 1.8 pence per litre between July and August 2017, to stand at 115.7 pence per litre as measured in the CPIH.
- A 1 pence change on average in the cost of a litre of motor fuel contributes approximately
 0.02 percentage points to the 1-month change in the CPIH.

HOUSING (RPI)

Mortgage interest payments (MIPs)

- The Bank of England Bank Rate rose to 0.75% on Thursday 2 August 2018. The next announcement and minutes from the Bank of England's Monetary Policy Committee are scheduled to be published on 13 September 2018.
- The change in average mortgage interest rates recorded in the RPI was -0.01 percentage points between July and August 2017. The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.25% in July 2017.
- A one percentage point change in the average mortgage interest rate contributes approximately 1.0 percentage points to the 1-month percentage change in the RPI.



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
