SUMMARY

CPIH

The Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) is the most comprehensive measure of inflation. It extends the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) to include a measure of the costs associated with owning, maintaining and living in one's own home, known as owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH), along with Council Tax. Both of these are significant expenses for many households and are not included in the CPI.

Aside from including owner occupiers' housing costs (OOH) and Council Tax, CPIH is otherwise identical to CPI. This means that, aside from these two components, the factors contributing to the CPI rate are the same as those contributing to the CPIH. For example, if food is reported as increasing the CPIH rate, it is also acting to increase the CPI rate. The size of the contributions for components other than OOH and Council Tax are exaggerated in the CPI compared with the CPIH because they account for a larger proportion of the overall index.

The <u>National Statistics</u> status of the Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) was reinstated on 31 July 2017. <u>A letter</u> from the Director General for Regulation to the National Statistician detailed the actions that were taken to meet the requirements as set out in the <u>CPIH</u> assessment report.

The main movements for CPIH in March 2019 are:

- The all items CPIH is 107.0, up from 106.8 in February.
- The all items CPIH annual rate is 1.8%, unchanged from last month.
- The annual rate for CPIH excluding indirect taxes, CPIHY, is 1.7%, up from 1.6% last month.
- The OOH component of CPIH is 106.4, up from 106.3 in February.
- The OOH component annual rate is 1.1%, unchanged from last month.
- The CPIH all goods index is 105.1, up from 104.8 in February.
- The CPIH all goods index annual rate is 1.3%, unchanged from last month.
- The CPIH all services index is 108.4, up from 108.3 in February.
- The CPIH all services index annual rate is 2.2%, unchanged from last month.

Consumer Prices Index (CPI)

The CPI continues to be a National Statistic and is a measure of consumer price inflation produced to international standards and in line with European regulations. First published in 1997 as the Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP), the CPI is the inflation measure used in the Government's target for inflation.



The CPI is also used for purposes such as uprating pensions, wages and benefits and can aid in the understanding of inflation on family budgets. For more information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for CPI in March 2019 are:

- The all items CPI is 107.0, up from 106.8 in February.
- The all items CPI annual rate is 1.9%, unchanged from last month.
- The annual rate for CPI excluding indirect taxes, CPIY, is 1.8%, unchanged from last month.
- The annual rate for CPI at constant tax rates, CPI-CT, is 1.8%, up from 1.7% last month.
- The CPI all goods index is 105.1, up from 104.8 in February.
- The CPI all goods index annual rate is 1.3%, unchanged from last month.
- The CPI all services index is 109.1, up from 109.0 in February.
- The CPI all services index annual rate is 2.5%, unchanged from last month.

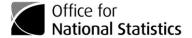
Retail Prices Index (RPI)

In accordance with the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007, the Retail Prices Index and its derivatives have been assessed against the Code of Practice for Official Statistics and found not to meet the required standard for designation as National Statistics. The <u>full</u> <u>assessment report</u> can be found on the UK Statistics Authority website.

The RPI is a legacy measure of UK inflation that continues to be published because of its use in long-term contracts and index-linked gilts. For further information see <u>Users and uses of consumer price inflation statistics</u>.

The main movements for RPI in March 2019 are:

- The all items RPI is 285.1, up from 285.0 in February.
- The all items RPI annual rate is 2.4%, down from 2.5% last month.
- The annual rate for RPIX, the all items RPI excluding mortgage interest payments (MIPs), is 2.4%, unchanged from last month.
- The all goods RPI is 217.3, up from 216.8 in February.
- The all goods RPI annual rate is 2.3%, unchanged from last month.
- The all services RPI is 388.3, up from 388.1 in February.
- The all services RPI annual rate is 2.7%, unchanged from last month.

Small upward effects came from:

- Transport, where prices fell between February and March this year but by less than between the same two months a year ago. The upward effect within this grouping came from motor fuels. Petrol prices rose by 1.2 pence per litre between February and March 2019 compared with a fall of 1.6 pence per litre a year ago. They now stand on average at 120.3 pence per litre. Similarly, diesel prices rose by 1.4 pence per litre this year to stand at 130.7 pence per litre, compared with a fall of 1.5 pence per litre a year ago. This upward effect was partially offset by smaller downward contributions coming from new cars and air fares, the latter principally from European routes;
- Miscellaneous goods and services, with prices for personal care products rising this year but falling a year ago. This category includes toiletries, cosmetics and personal electrical appliances such as hairdryers and straighteners; and



 Clothing and footwear, where clothing prices continued to rise following the January sales period but by more than a year ago. The upward effect came principally from a variety of women's clothing items.

A large downward effect came from:

• Recreation and culture, where prices rose by 0.2% between February and March 2019 compared with a larger rise of 0.6% between the same two months of 2018. Within this group, the largest downward effect came from games, toys and hobbies, particularly computer games. Price movements for these can often be relatively large depending on the composition of bestseller charts and the downward contribution between the latest two months follows an upward contribution between January and February 2019. There was also a small downward effect from recording media, which fell in price this year but rose in 2018.

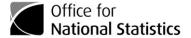
A small downward effect came from:

• Food and non-alcoholic beverages, with prices rising by less between February and March this year than between the same two months a year ago. The downward contribution came from a range of categories, with the single largest effect coming from oils and fats, where prices of margarine and low-fat spread fell this year but rose a year ago.

- Prices overall rose this year but fell a year ago, particularly for half chocolate coated biscuits and individual fruit pies.



Meat

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago.

Milk, cheese and eggs

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago.

Oils and fats

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago, particularly for margarine/low fat spread.

Fruit

- Small downward effect.
- Prices overall fell this year by more than a year ago.

Vegetables including potatoes

- Small upward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year by more than a year ago, with the main upward contributions coming from premium potato crisps and canned vegetables.
- Partially offset by a downward contribution coming from fresh/chilled vegetables, where
 prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago.

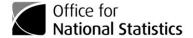

Fuels and lubricants

- Large upward effect.
- Prices overall rose this year but fell a year ago.
- The average price of petrol across the month, as recorded for the CPIH, rose by 1.2 pence per litre between February and March 2019, to stand at 120.3 pence per litre.
- Last year, the average price of petrol fell by 1.6 pence per litre between February and March 2018, to stand at 119.2 pence per litre.

 - Vehicle tax and insurance, where average premiums for car insurance rose this year but fell a year ago; and, to a lesser extent
 - Maintenance of motor vehicles, where prices overall rose this year by more than a year ago.
- Partially offset by **purchase of motor vehicles**, where prices overall fell this year but rose a year ago, with the main downward contributions coming from the purchase of second-hand and new cars.

RECONCILIATION OF CPIH AND RPI

(Table 5a of the Consumer Price Inflation Dataset)

This table identifies the main factors contributing to the differences between the unrounded inflation rates for the CPIH and the RPI. These differences are broken down into: mortgage interest payments, other housing components excluded from the CPIH, imputed rents (included in CPIH and excluded from RPI), other differences in the coverage of goods and services, and the formula effect. The final component titled 'other differences including weights' is derived as a residual.

The corresponding figures for the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) can be found in Table 5b of the Consumer price inflation dataset.

The difference between the CPIH and RPI unrounded annual rates in March 2019 was -0.63 percentage points, narrowing from -0.67 percentage points in February 2019.

The main factor contributing to the narrowing was:

• Other housing components, which decreased the RPI 12-month rate relative to the CPIH 12-month rate by 0.02 percentage points between February and March 2019. The effect came mainly from house depreciation.

There were no offsetting factors.

OUTLOOK

FOOD

Seasonal Food

 With the exception of 2013, seasonal food prices have tended to fall in April of recent years and are typically dependent on weather conditions both in the UK and around the world.

HOUSING, WATER, ELECTRICITY, GAS AND OTHER FUELS

Council Tax

- The Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) announced that the average Band D council tax set by local authorities in England for 2019-20 will be £1,750 a 4.7% increase on last year. (www.gov.uk 27 March 2019)
- Council tax bills had been frozen in Scotland since 2007. From April 2017, the freeze was replaced with discretion for local authorities to increase council tax by a maximum of 3% per



- year. For 2019, the Scottish government has signalled that the thirty-two local authorities could raise bills by up to 4.79%. (www.bbc.co.uk 6 March 2019)
- The Welsh Government announced that the average band D council tax for Wales for 2019-20 is £1,591 – a 6.6% increase on last year. (gov.wales 21 March 2019)
- The recorded increase for council tax and rates in the CPIH last April was 4.9%.

Social Housing Rents

• The Summer 2015 Budget announced that rents for social housing would decrease by 1% each year for four years, starting in April 2016.

Regulations have been laid before Parliament to uplift NHS dental charges in England from 1
April 2019. Charges will rise from £21.60 to £22.70 for Band 1, from £59.10 to £62.10 for
Band 2 and from £256.50 to £269.30 for Band 3. (www.parliament.uk 11 March 2019)

TRANSPORT

Fuels and Lubricants

• Recent oil price recoveries have halted with Brent futures falling below \$71 per barrel on signals that Russia may exit production cuts. Losses were limited by a tightening of global supplies, as output has fallen in Iran and Venezuela amid signs the United States will further toughen sanctions on those two OPEC producers. Brent crude futures were at \$71.15 a barrel, having earlier slid below \$71 per barrel. Brent had previously hit its highest level since November 2012 at \$71.87. (uk.reuters.com 15 April 2019)



- When considering the price of petrol between March and April 2019, it may be useful to note that the average price of petrol rose by 1.5 pence per litre between March and April 2018, to stand at 120.7 pence per litre as measured in the CPIH.
- A 1 pence change on average in the cost of a litre of motor fuel contributes approximately
 0.02 percentage points to the 1-month change in the CPIH.

Passenger Transport by Air

• Air fares have shown variable movements in April which can depend on the position of Easter.

HOUSING (RPI)

Mortgage interest payments (MIPs)

- The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.75% on Thursday 21 March 2019. The next announcement and minutes from the Bank of England's Monetary Policy Committee are scheduled to be published on 2 May 2019.
- The change in average mortgage interest rates recorded in the RPI was -0.01 percentage points between March and April 2018. The Bank of England Bank Rate remained unchanged at 0.5% in March 2018.
